'Artist In The Community' Project

Led by Creative Spark, this project brings communities throughout the county together to celebrate the life and legacy of St. Brigid through art and creativity.



The four artists taking part are Susan Farrelly and Una Curley who are both textile & mixed media artists, Claire McAteer who is a textile & print artist, and Etaoin O'Reilly, a ceramicist. The artists are working with a number of community groups and schools to develop a series of art works centered on the theme of St. Brigid. It is anticipated that about 15 pieces of art ranging in various sizes will be on display during the Brigid 1500 commemorations.

'St. Brigid's Cloak' Project

A newly designed St. Brigid's Cloak by the students of St. Brigid's School, Ard Easmuinn, will also be on display during the exhibition.

An initiative of the Creative Ireland Louth programme and Louth County Council Arts office, the cloak has been designed and facilitated by artist Shauna Swords. The students worked with Shauna, meticulously creating individual impressions onto hundreds of specially cut copper foil circles. Each circle was hand stenciled, then stitched and glued together to create strands of vibrant and detailed work, which all came together to make this spectacular life sized cloak.
